	The European Media Freedom Act (EMFA) underlines that regulatory cooperation between independent media regulatory authorities or bodies is essential to making the internal market for media services function properly and introduces a number of provisions to ensure consistency and good practice in such cooperation.		
	Given that the Audiovisual Media Services Directive (AVMSD) did not provide for a structured cooperation framework for national regulatory authorities or bodies, ERGA agreed on a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) which set out non-binding mechanisms for cross-border cooperation. Building on the achievements of the MoU, EMFA introduced a set of dedicated mechanisms for a structured regulatory cooperation between the national regulatory authorities or bodies (NRAs). These include in particular (i) structured cooperation (Article 14), with a specific accelerated cooperation mechanism and (ii) requests for enforcement of obligations of video-sharing platform providers (Article 15).		
Background	As an additional part of its toolbox for the regulatory cooperation, EMFA put in place a dedicated mechanism to coordinate measures concerning media services from outside the Union (Article 17). Under this mechanism, the new Board for Media Services is obliged to:		
	 at the request of the NRAs from at least two Member States, coordinate measures by the NRAs concerned related to the dissemination of or access to certain media services coming from third countries. The Board has also power to issue, in consultation with the Commission, opinions on such measures; 		
	 in consultation with the Commission, develop a set of criteria for the use by NRAs when they exercise their regulatory powers over media actors addressed by the coordination mechanism. 		
	Article 12 of the EMFA also establishes a mechanism for the Board to consult relevant media sectors, operating at Union or national level, when it considers matters beyond the audiovisual media sector. The Board's rules of procedure have to set out how this consultation mechanism should work.		

The principal aim of this working group is therefore to focus on developing a framework for the various cooperation and coordination mechanisms envisaged in the EMFA.

Additionally, the Board recognizes the importance of cooperation with other institutions and bodies in seeking regulatory coherence more generally, and this working group will therefore also support the Board's external cooperation efforts.

For these reasons, the working group envisages the following dedicated workstreams:

1) Workstream on cross-border cooperation under Articles 14 and 15 of the EMFA:

The main objective of this workstream would be to establish the minimum arrangements for the functioning of the relevant cooperation mechanisms. The workstream would be practical and would aim to provide procedural tools for requests under Articles 14 and 15. The objective would be also to initiate internal discussion on the possible long-term solutions and improvements of the cooperation, also in coordination with Communication's Group. Regarding the **structured cooperation set up in Article 14**, the minimum arrangements and initial administrative practices would eventually be included in additional operational Guidelines. Regarding the **mechanism under Article 15**, the work would also include identifying the pool of mediators to work on requests under Article 15, as needed. Lastly, the workstream will aim to monitor and assess the implementation of the cooperation mechanisms under article 14 and 15 of EMFA.

2) Workstream on the criteria envisaged in Article 17 of the EMFA;

The main objective of this workstream would be to develop criteria for NRAs or bodies to use when taking measures to restrict the dissemination of services from outside the EU or when otherwise exercising their regulatory powers over such providers (e.g. when considering their licensing) and develop a practical and concise tool to help them apply the restrictive measures in a consistent way. The workstream would also collect core criteria and preconditions for taking such measures to support any Members who need to take such measures in future. In order to ensure that the list of criteria and conditions are relevant for all NRAs, it will be based on mapping the existing competences and conditions under which NRAs can issue such measures. An option would also be to organize a debate to discuss their practical application and possible further updates or specification.

3) Workstream on the mapping of stakeholders to be included in the consultation mechanism;

The objective of this workstream would be to prepare for future consultations where the Board deals with matters beyond the audiovisual media sector, as foreseen by Article 12 of EMFA. In line with the EMFA such a list of stakeholders would include entities operating both at the national and European levels. To

ensure the list is established in an open and inclusive manner, the workstream would launch a call for expressions of interest by entities wishing to be included in the database. An option would be to organize a workshop/roundtable to discuss practical arrangements for this mechanism and familiarize key stakeholders with NRAs' and the Board's work.

4) Workstream on the methods of cooperation of the Media Board with other Union bodies, offices, agencies and expert/advisory groups

The objective of this workstream would be to develop a network for regular exchange with experts from other relevant international organizations in view of further advancing the level of expertise of the Board. In the context of its activities, the workstream would also seek synergies with the workstream of the Working Group 4, notably responsible for the cooperation between the Board and the European Board for Digital Services.

Where relevant, the Working Group will identify synergies with other Working Groups, especially the Working Groups 2,3 and 4.
